



Upon your arrival in New York City, you will be met at the railroad station by an Army Officer who will be in uniform. During your sojourn in New York before sailing for Europe, and upon your return from Europe, you will stop at the Hotel McAlpin, Broadway and 34th Street, New York City.

All mail intended to reach you between June 4th, 1931, the day you sail from the United States, and June 26th, 1931, the day you leave Europe, should be addressed to you in care of American Pilgrimage, 146 Avenue des Champs Elysees, Paris, France; for example:

In making reservations for your journey home from New York City, it is necessary for this office to furnish the railroads with the exact time and date of your departure. Upon your return from Europe, it will therefore be necessary for you to remain in the hotel over night as a guest of the United States Government.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.


