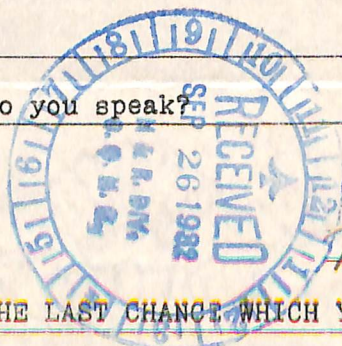

It is indeed regretted that you cannot accept the offer of the Government at this time. However, it is hoped that your health will improve and that you will make the journey before the conclusion of the pilgrimages in 1933 as it is thought that you would derive comfort and solace from a visit to the grave of your husband.

In the event your health improves, it is believed you should feel no hesitancy in going as competent personnel to care for the comfort and needs of the woman will be provided and doctors and nurses will be in attendance. During the past three years over six thousand mothers and widows, many of whom were in very poor health, made the pilgrimage and appeared to benefit by the sea air and the excellent care they received. If you later feel able to make the trip next summer, it is requested you advise this office and arrangements will be made for you.
