

We were advancing in squad column toward Mouson on the morning of Nov. 6th at 11:00 A.M. when the enemy suddenly opened fire with machine guns, artillery and all. Only a few moments had elapsed when I saw Cpl. Barger's body up in the air, his head entirely severed at the shoulders. He had received a direct hit from a small field piece. His death was instantaneous. I do not know where he was buried as we had to move forward.

Cpl. Milton Barger, Company C, 18th Infantry is grave 20, row 2, Block F, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.







Diagram represents the mouth wide open.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.


