1. The permanent grave of this officer is No. 3 Row 23
Block B, The American Cemetery of Suresnes, Department of Seine, France.

2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.






Accompanying Mrs. Barnes, who had come to France to visit the Grave of her husband, and who had received assurance that in due course the body would be transported to the United States for interment, I noticed a black mark on the top of the cross. On demanding an explanation of this I was informed that this was an indication for the transferring of the body to another portion of the same cemetery where the 'civilians' were to be grouped. I learned also that there were few more bodies to be taken up, and that the final arranging of the cemetery was about to be commenced.

Mrs. Barnes was naturally much perturbed on learning that some oversight has occurred, as definite assurance was given that Captain Barnes body should be transferred. I have written to our Colonel Parker (120 West 14th Street, New York City) the Officer responsible for our Welfare Work amongst the American Forces, and undoubtedly he will be communicating with Washington direct on the subject. I make this formal report in the hope that some enquiry may be made from this side, thus hastening the fulfilment of the widow and the family of the late Captain Barnes.
