Informant was an eye witness of Sgt Barnett's death. The ground was held by our troops at the time. Sgt Barnett was killed by shrapnel near Mount des Ellieux, France, in the Meuse Argonne offensive on Sept. 26, 1918. This occurred near a stream between Foret de Hesse and Bois de Cheppy. Death was instantaneous as body of deceased was blown to pieces. Informant buried deceased. He identified him at the time by means of his identification tags. Informant knew christian name and initials of deceased. There was no other man of same name as that of deceased, in company or battalion. Deceased was a very ~~km~~ big man of very strong stature, had dark brown hair and blue eyes. Informant had known deceased since organization was in Camp Lewis, in the United States. No other information available on death and burial of Sgt Barnett.

Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

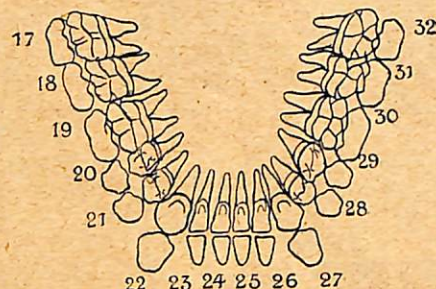
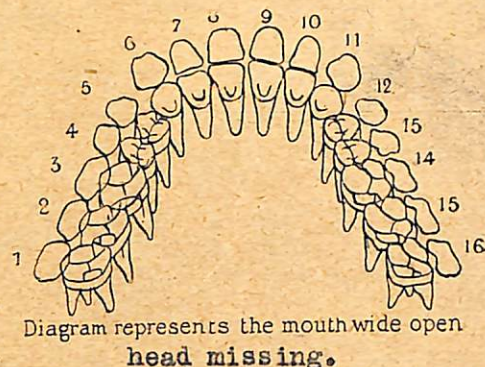

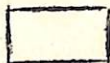
