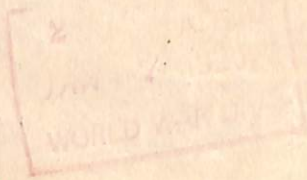

The company advanced into Fismette on the morning of Aug. 10th. Some of the men isolated from the company by a street swept by machine gun fire. Barniki and several comrades took shelter in an old house and started to tunnel the street in order to evacuate the wounded whom they had collected and had with them in their shelter. A German Trench Mortar shell hit the tunnel while the men were at work and Barniki was killed instantly with several comrades. He was buried at Fismette.

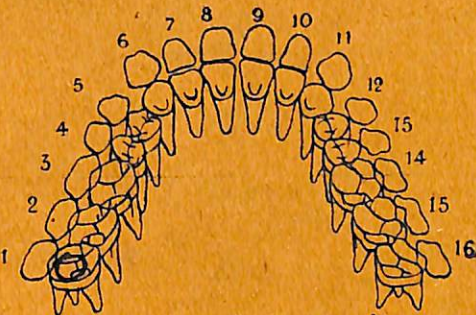
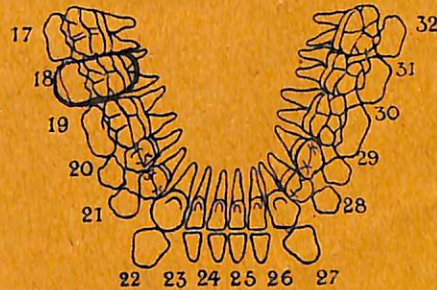


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

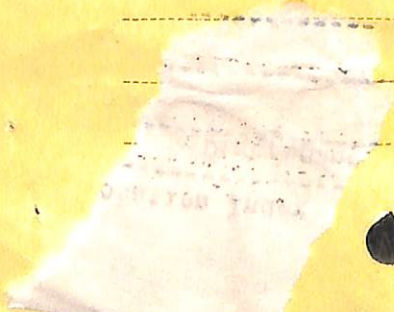
