Reference is made to previous correspondence with this office relative to a pilgrimage to the cemeteries of Europe in honor of your son, the late Private Judson A. Barrett, who died aboard the Adriatic October 15, 1918 and was buried at sea.

In reply to an inquiry you advised you did not desire to make the journey in 1932. It is noted that you previously stated your health was poor, and your attention is invited to the fact that competent personnel to care for the comfort and needs of the women making the pilgrimages will be provided and doctors and nurses will be available. During the past two years a number of women in poor health and of advanced age made the pilgrimage and appeared to benefit by the sea air and the excellent care they received. It is believed, therefore, you should feel no hesitancy in making the journey.

Arrangements have been made for the mothers and widows of veterans who were lost or buried at sea during the World War to sail May 25, 1932, on the PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT. A special itinerary has been arranged which will include memorial services to be held at sea May 30th in honor of the veterans buried therein. The names of veterans who were buried at sea will be inscribed in memorial chapels now under construction in the Brookwood American Cemetery, London, England, and the Suresnes American Cemetery, Paris, France, and while the names may not be inscribed by June 1932, the itinerary prepared for the mothers and widows of these heroes will include visits to both cemeteries, as well as sightseeing trips in and about London and Paris.

Should you reconsider and desire to make a pilgrimage this year, sailing May 25th, it is requested that you advise this office at the earliest practicable date in order that the necessary arrangements may be made for you.

In the event you take advantage of the offer of the Government and make the trip, you are assured that everything possible for your comfort and happiness will be provided. In other words you will be the honored guest of the United States Government.

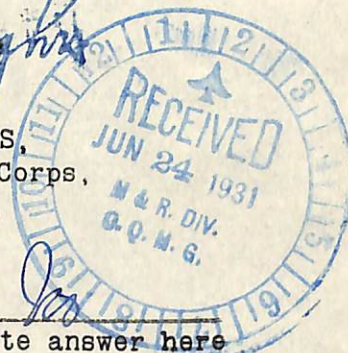

During the past two years a number of women in poor health and of advanced age made the pilgrimage and appeared to benefit by the sea air and the excellent care they received. It is believed, therefore, you should feel no hesitancy in making the journey.

Arrangements have been made for the mothers and widows of veterans who were lost or buried at sea during the World War to sail May 25, 1932, on the PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT. A special itinerary has been arranged which will include memorial services to be held at sea May 30th in honor of the veterans buried therein. The names of veterans who were buried at sea will be inscribed in memorial chapels now under construction in the Brookwood American Cemetery, London, England, and the Suresnes American Cemetery, Paris, France, and while the names may not be inscribed by June 1932, the itinerary prepared for the mothers and widows of these heroes will include visits to both cemeteries, as well as sightseeing trips in and about London and Paris.

Should you reconsider and desire to make a pilgrimage this year, sailing May 25th, it is requested that you advise this office at the earliest practicable date in order that the necessary arrangements may be made for you.

In the event you take advantage of the offer of the Government and make the trip, you are assured that everything possible for your comfort and happiness will be provided. In other words you will be the honored guest of the United States Government.
