Receipt is acknowledged of the form letter completed by you relative to the eligibility of Miss Kathleen V. Barry to make a pilgrimage to the grave of the late Private Lewis Walter Barry, under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act of March 2, 1929, which reads in part as follows: "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces."

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as your brother was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 23 years and 10 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, you are advised that Miss Kathleen V. Barry is ineligible within the meaning of the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

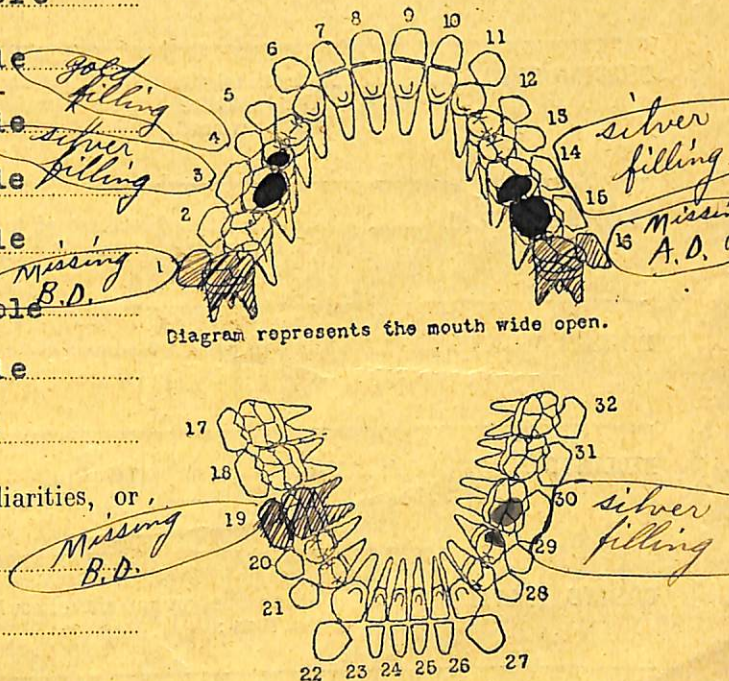
