

Killed in action on Hill 253, France on 8 October 1918. Last seen about 10 minutes before the American barrage was sent over on this spot, at which time he was severely wounded and aid was unable to get to him. He apparently expired during this barrage. Burial place unknown, exactly, but on this Hill.

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of Corporal Harry B. Bartlett, Company H, 38th Infantry, is Grave 13, Row 36, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon (Meuse), France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.






