The United States Army requests a statement from you as to your wishes regarding the disposition of the remains of your late son, Pvt. 1/c Joseph BARTOSIEWICZ, #751368, Co. A, 6th Inf., Cem. #1233, Thiaucourt, Meurthe-et-Moselle, France.

The American Government is prepared to bury these remains:

- (a) In a National Cemetery in the United States;
- (b) Concentrate the remains for permanent burial in a permanent American cemetery in France;
- (c) Transport the remains to your address, at the expense of the U.S. Government, provided the health regulations and sanitary laws will permit the entry of the remains, and provided the deceased was, for a period of time prior to his enlistment in the U.S. Army, a resident of the city, town or neighbourhood in which you live. If the deceased was not a resident of the place at which you now live, this Service will transport the remains to such place at which he was a resident. Burial expenses are to be borne by you.




