Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the friend of the late Private, first class Frank Bartozewes, Co. C, 115th Inf., whose remains are now interred in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagnous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.

For your reply, you may use the enclosed envelope which requires no postage.

1. In response to your communication of recent date, relative to the final disposition of the remains of Private Frank Bartozaves, you are advised that the expenses of the transfer of the bodies, including transportation, casket, shipping case, flag, and the preparation of the remains for shipment, will be paid by the United States. The expenses not to exceed \$100. will be paid by the War Risk Insurance Bureau upon the receipt of a bill from the person entitled to make such claim. These expenses include various items connected with the funeral, after the body is turned over to the relatives: such as, burial site, hire of hearse, flowers, etc. Claim for such expense must be made upon an application form (form 531) provided by the Bureau of War Risk Insurance.

2. The records of this office show that this soldier was killed in action October 13, 1918 while serving as Private 1st Class, in Company C, 115th Infantry. His army serial number is 1,284,546.

3. In an effort to obtain information concerning the location of the grave of Private Bartozaves, a copy of your letter is being referred to the Graves Registration Service, Washington, D. C., with the request that you be advised direct relative to the matter.

4. It is desired to express to you the sincere sympathy of the Department on account of the great loss you have sustained in the death of this soldier.
