place of our heroes.

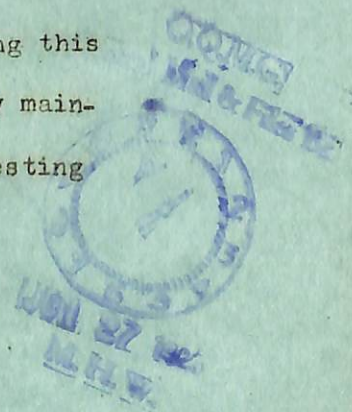

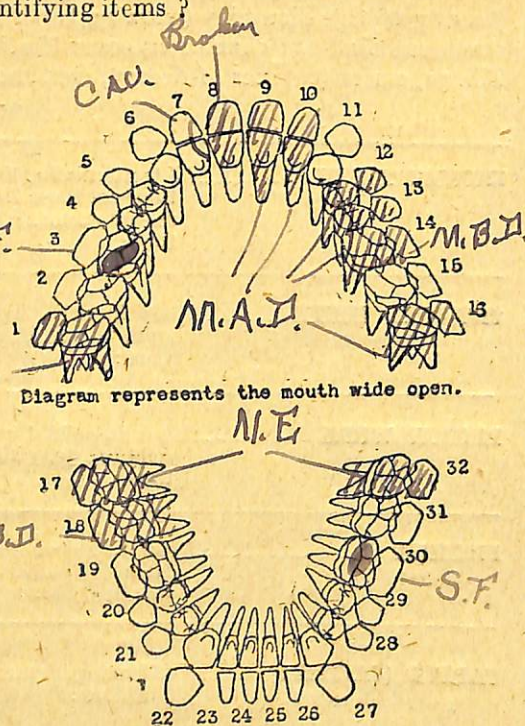
