





This was done in the hope that all who may make the pilgrimage will derive a measure of comfort and solace from the visit.

You are numbered among those who are privileged to make this pilgrimage.

During July and September of this year, inquiries were addressed to you as to whether or not you desire to make the pilgrimage to Europe. To these inquiries no reply has been received from you.

You probably do not realize how important it is that a reply be received from you. If we do not receive replies, it becomes very difficult to make the necessary and proper arrangements for those who are to make the trip, as everything must be arranged in advance. Consequently, it is just as important for the Government to know the names of those who do not desire to take advantage of its offer as it is to know the names of those who do.

Will you please devote a few moments of your time to write either the word "YES" or "NO" in the following space_____, thus indicating whether or not you desire to make the pilgrimage during 1933 and sign your name here_____. The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

IT IS REQUESTED THAT YOU GIVE THE MATTER YOUR MOST CAREFUL CONSIDERATION BEFORE REACHING A DECISION, BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS IS THE LAST OPPORTUNITY YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE THE TRIP AT GOVERNMENT EXPENSE.

In order to assure proper and satisfactory accommodations for the mothers and widows making the journey in 1933, reservations for steamship transportation must be made by this office several months in advance. It is requested that you answer the questions below by writing "Yes" or "No" or "Undecided" in the blank space following the question. When you have answered the question, sign your name and return this sheet in the enclosed addressed envelope which requires no postage. PLEASE DO NOT DELAY, as it is essential that the information be in this office promptly.

This makes the fourth letter I wrote you since I was asked to make the trip. I wrote a letter on the 15th and one on the 25th, and one on the 21st, 1929. Now you want to know all about my child Celly E. Batts. Yes he is mine. God knows it is true I got witnesses as I sent you word in my last letter before this one, I got witnesses both white and colored. I live two miles and half from Jacksonville, N. C. by railroad, two miles by water, five miles by hard surface. Nelson Williams, Onley Sidbuary, Allen Sidbuary, John P. Sidbuary, James Cladon, Walter Batts, A. L. Batts, Alice Sidbuary, Salmon Hardson, Madge King, Jessie Spicer, Line Sidbuary, Mitchell Edham, Jack Sidbuary, all of them knowed about Celly E. Batts being my son and will say by the holy holy Bible. Will you ask them how about it. Oh yes nothing can debar me from my many good friends. All them folks I named you is living. I has not named one person except two that my son Kelly and my dear husband Obid Batts. Any my dear son Kelly E. Batts was my knee baby. That boy was so true to me and his father he would fetch in from \$12 to \$15 sometimes more or less in a week. He was smart. He said "Mother I have to leave you but I must go and fight for our land and country".

The very lade that named him is living about one mile in a gully from me. Her name is Mollie Spicer. She carried him outdoors before he was a month old. She named my baby Kelly. The board called him Kelly E. Batts for a short name, and his granny doctor is living too at Elizabeth City about 174 miles from Jacksonville, N. C. Here is her letter. Kelly E. Batts is my child and you can't find another Kelly E. Batts or another Hetty Batts in this place. No, why I doubt you can find another one in North Carolina. So all you got to do my good people just send my money like you have for I sure need it now. I never been in this fix before, not since I have been grown so please sure send some money. Not since the first of June 1929 since I received anything. About ten checks behind. I think you treated me wrong. Really what do you think and did you send word to Mr. Jones the undertaker at Jacksonville to take charge of me being my godson. I will do whatever you say as far as right in getting my money, but I can regard my money all OK. If any man or woman, colored or white, old or young can come up and say anything wrong of me bring he or her to me Hetty Batts. I had pretty good health all my life. I was right sick in 1928 but I have no money to help myself now. Oh think of it. God requires goodness among all men. Consider this at once please sir. Oh yes I have been writing and writing and still I thank you for writing about money needing to me. So I won't tell you nothing that was not true because my home is heaven and I am asking you your help now at once. Don't you think I have been patient. I know you will degree with me. I stayed with my white folks until I got married. I love them as well as my colored. Yes I do. I knows when I am treated right.
