Receipt is acknowledged of form letter completed by you indicating that you stood in loco parentis to the late Private Gustave H. Bauer.

The only provision of the law under which anyone other than the mother or widow could be considered for the privilege of making a pilgrimage is contained in section 4 (a) of the Act of March 2, 1929, which was amended May 15, 1930, to read in part as follows: "-or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming eighteen years of age".

In order to satisfy the legal requirements, it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of the relationship, in loco parentis, the affidavits of at least two persons not related to you.



Receipt is acknowledged of the form letter from this office dated September 9, 1929, completed by you, furnishing information requested in connection with the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929.

In connection with the desire of Mrs. Margaret Bauer Mulleahy to visit the grave of her brother, the late Private Gustav H. Bauer, Company D, 125th Infantry, it is assumed you request this privilege under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as Private Bauer was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 30 years and 7 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that Mrs. Mulleahy is ineligible within the meaning of the law, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.



The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of the late Private Gustav H. Bauer, Company D, 125th Infantry, is Grave 16, Row 28, Block F, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State, from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open


