

The Quartermaster General desires to invite your attention to the inclosed card which gives the permanent cemetery location of the soldier's grave in which you are interested.





"Sgt. Robert Baughn was leading his platoon in the battle of the Meuse-Argonne on October 4th 1918. Strong enemy machine gun fire was encountered and a machine gun bullet struck him near the heart, killing him instantly. I was in charge of the detail that buried him near Fleville, Sgt. Baughn's extraordinary courage and bravery under fire was known to all of his comrades, who loved him well, and his death was a source of genuine sorrow to all. Up to the time of his death, Sgt. Baughn had participated in all of the important engagements of Montdidier, Soissons, St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne."

The remains of an Unknown American soldier have recently been found in the Commune of Fleville very near the reported place of burial of Sgt. Baughn. This soldier has two small silver fillings in his teeth, two broken ribs, sergeant's chevrons on his blouse and a signal revolver. He was lying on a slicker and was buried two feet deep.

As you were in charge of the detail that buried Sgt. Baughn, it is requested that you please advise this office whether he was buried on a slicker; if he was wounded through the ribs, and if he carried a signal revolver.

Regret to advise that I do not know the place of
Sgt. Baughn's burial, nature of wounds, kind of grave, land marks,
or any other details concerning his burial.

I was interested to read the copy of the report of
Pvt. Michael Reilly, but my memory fails to place any such report
in the records of Company G, 16th Infantry concerning the death
and burial of Sgt. Baughn. It is my recollection that the report
is substantially correct concerning his leading his platoon in
the battle of the Meuse-Argonne and being struck with a rifle
bullet near the heart. However, at the time, we received no report
of any of our company attending to the burial of Sgt. Baughn. Such
a report may have been made later. This Michael Reilly was wounded
in the battle of Soissons, but according to my recollection of the
records, was reported as "killed" upon information which we then
thought accurate. However, when we were on duty in Germany, sometime
after December 1, 1918, Michael Reilly reported for duty to us there,
and explained how he had been wounded in action and treated later
at a hospital. Now- my recollection is that Reilly was not a member
of the company at the time we entered the Meuse-Argonne, and his
report may be inaccurate, unless- he were a member of some other
company and accidentally came across the body of Sgt. Baughn. The
records of Company G, or better still-his service record- could be
searched to find this information.

The battle of the Meuse-Argonne burial squads worked
behind the line of advance, at quite a distance in the rear, and
the advancing companies had not time, nor was it advisable, to stop
and bury the dead. It is unfortunate that this soldier's grave was
not marked, for he was, as the accompanying report says, a man
loved by his comrades, a man of great courage in danger, whose
presence lent confidence to his men.
