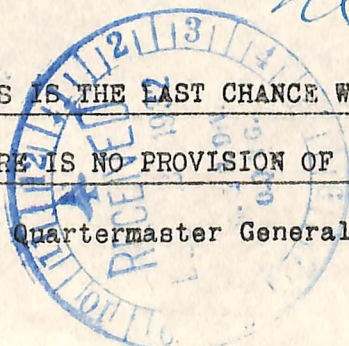

Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of November 21st advising that your health will not permit you to make a pilgrimage to the grave of your son, the late Private Barney Bazeloek, and requesting that your daughter be allowed to go in your place.

It is regretted to advised that there is no provision of the law governing the pilgrimage which will permit the Government to transfer the privilege of making the journey to a relative or friend in the event the mother or widow is unable or does not desire to make the trip.

Your desire to have a member of your family make the pilgrimage to the resting place of your son is understood and appreciated, but I am sure you will realize that the War Department is powerless to do other than carry out the law as passed by Congress.

It is deeply regretted that you are unable to accept the last offer of the Government to make the pilgrimage. Should your health improve and you desire to go before the conclusion of the pilgrimages in 1933, it is requested you advise this office and arrangements will be made for you. You would receive the best of care and attention at all times and every consideration would be given your physical condition.

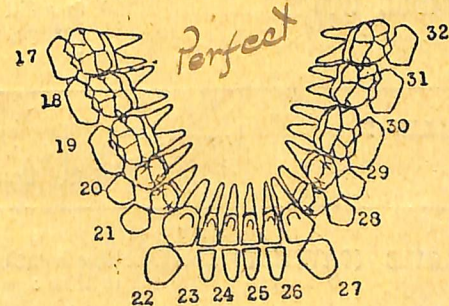
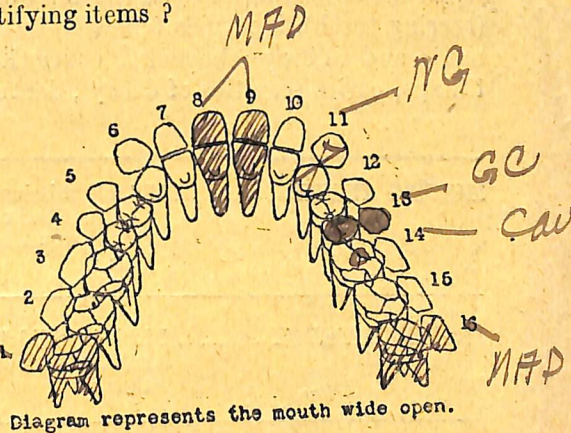

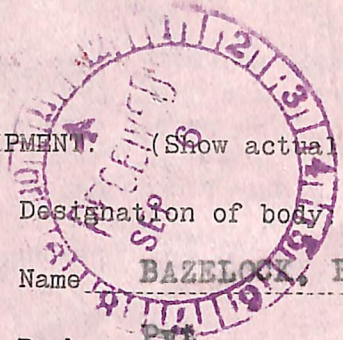
