





Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of March 29th, 1922 enclosing letter from Mrs. Lula G. Beach, Albany, Illinois relative to the case of her husband, the late Private Frank I. Beach, Company K., 147th Infantry.

The press notice to the effect that no further original requests for the return of a body will be considered after April first applied to those cases where no request had previously been made, either for the return of a body or its retention in Europe. The Secretary of War decided July 27th, 1921 that in cases where a request had been made that a body remain permanently interred in Europe no change of such request to one for return to the United States would be accepted after August 15th, 1921 and the Department has consistently adhered to this ruling.

The files of this office contain Mrs. Beach's request that the remains of her husband be permanently interred in France and in view of the above ruling, it is not now in order to cancel this request and return the body to the United States. You can readily understand that should no date be fixed beyond which changes of requests would not be accepted these changes would continue indefinitely thereby disarranging concentration plans in Europe as well as entailing additional expense to this Government.
