Subject: Information concerning burial of D. Beaumont.

1. The only record I have is- Beaumont (62161) D. Pvt. buried June 20, 1918, Grave 16, American Cemetery, Vertuzey / Meuse.
2. This man was killed in an attack near Xivray in France along with a number of others in the 103 Infantry, 26th. Division, a few days previous.
3. His body was brought down for burial along with twenty eight others killed at the same time.
4. The bodies were prepared for burial under the direction of two Sergeants of the 103 Infantry.
5. Some of the bodies were in bad condition and identification had been difficult in some cases.
6. It was not known at the time of burial to which organization Beaumont belonged. If my memory serves me right there was no record of any such man on the roster of the 103 Infantry.
7. The Grave Location Blanks which I sent in were made up by the Sergeants to whom the work had been entrusted by the C. O. of the 103 Infantry.
8. I officiated at the burial of all these men assisted by a Roman Catholic Chaplain.
9. At the time of the burial I was Chaplain at Mobile Hospital No. 39 then situated at Aunoy sous Vertuzey.

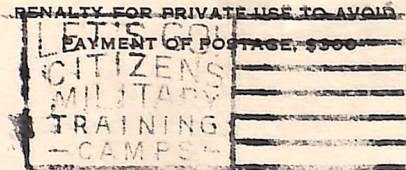

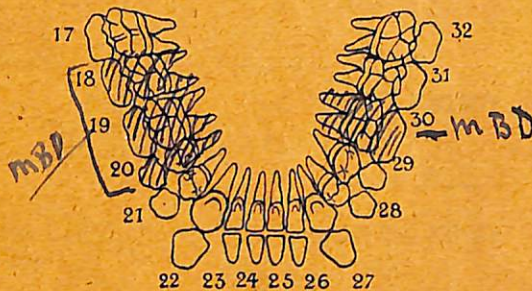
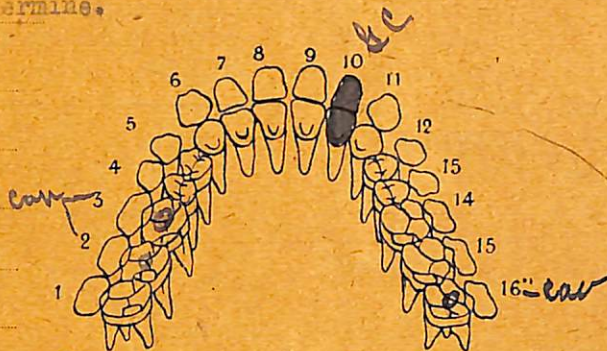
