



Form 1a shows burial of 52 men Cty 1281, grave 8 being an unknown. It has been found that Chaplains Austin, Dockery and Ganey made burials therein at different dates, Ganey making his burials on the ends of the rows started by the other men and at later dates.

And Dockery

Austin buried plot 2, graves 16 to 9, while Ganey later buried graves 8 and 7. In 7 he buried Heller and in 8 he reported Beeler, having no tags but a Loyal order of Moose card. Ganey gave as his grave number of Beeler #55.

A recheck of the entire burial plots shows that chaplains began their numbers just opposite to the Form 1a. and that grave 7 is same as 56, 8 as 55; 11 as 52; 12 as 51 etc.

Inasmuch as Chaplain buried Beeler in this grave and there is no marked discrepancy, this body is designated as Beeler.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.
