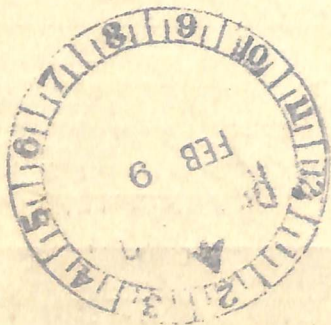

Oct. 9, 1918, about 3:30 AM near Chateau-Thierry I was in one hole and Bagley and another man were in a hole about 4 or 5 feet away. A shell hit closeby and killed both men in the other hole. They must have been killed instantly because there was no sound and both were dead when I looked in the hole 10 minutes later. We were relieved at that time and I know nothing of his burial.
