Receipt is acknowledged of your communication of recent date, furnishing information to assist this office in determining whether or not your sister, Miss Emma Beller, may be eligible to visit the grave of your brother, the late Private George S. Beller, under the loco parentis clause of the Act of March 2, 1929, as amended.

It has been held that a woman must have furnished a minor with food, clothing, shelter, guidance and counsel in order to be considered as having stood in loco parentis to the minor. The fact that your sister may have performed the household duties usually devolving upon a mother does not qualify her as having stood in loco parentis to your brother. It appears that your father supported his family and was considered the head of the house and it is therefore evident that your sister did not stand in loco parentis to your brother within the meaning of the law.

I appreciate that Miss Beller may have been of great assistance to your brother as well as the entire family, however this office has no alternative other than be governed by the provisions of the law.

It is regretted to advise therefore that no arrangements can be made for Miss Beller to make a pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of June 27, 1929, furnishing information requested by this office relative to the Gold Star Mothers' and Widows' Pilgrimage to Europe, authorized by the Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929.

It is noted you question the eligibility of your sister to make the pilgrimage under the terms of Section 4 (a) of the Act which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces". In determining who is meant by the term "who stood in loco parentis", this phrase has been given its usually accepted legal meaning and it has been held that:

- (a) A person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult who is not incapacitated either mentally or physically.
- (b) In order for a woman to occupy such a status towards a minor or incapacitated adult, she must act the part of a lawful father of such person in performing the duty of providing for him, intending thereby to take the place of the father in this particular.
- (c) In order to receive the benefits of the Act in question, she must have occupied the status toward a particular deceased member of the military or naval forces "for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

The records indicate that the late Private George S. Beller was 30 years of age when he entered the Army for service during the World War. As there is a positive showing that the soldier in question was not incapacitated either mentally or physically at the time of his entry into the military service and that he was more than 21 years of age, it is not possible within the meaning of the Act, for your sister to have stood in loco parentis to him for the year immediately preceding the commencement of his service in the Army. It is therefore regretted to advise that she is ineligible to make the pilgrimage, at the expense of the government.




