Your letter addressed to the Treasury Department has been handed to this office for answer. Relative to your desire to make a pilgrimage to the grave of your brother the late Private Frank Berglund, you are advised under the provisions of the Act of March 2, 1929, pilgrimages are authorized only for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces. The only provision of the law under which you could make the pilgrimage reads in part as follows: "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming 18 years of age."

However, in order to satisfy legal requirements it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of your relationship, in loco parentis, the affidavits of at least two persons who are not related to you.

In the event you consider yourself eligible, under the law, to make the pilgrimage it is requested that the enclosed form be completed and returned to this office in order that your eligibility under the Act may be determined. Under paragraph 1 (c) and 1 (d), sufficient information should be included to permit an intelligible decision as to eligibility.

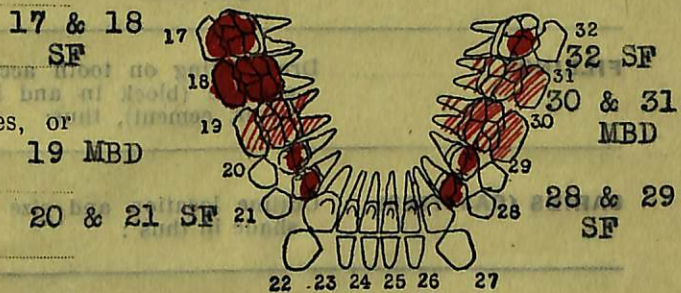
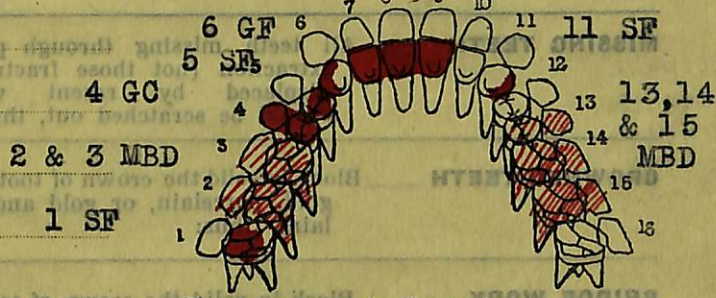
