Shipment home of remains of May Berry, Nurse, Base Hospital #32.

1. This office is in receipt of your letter of the 8th instant requesting shipment to Pittsburgh, Pa., of the remains of your sister, May Berry, Nurse, Base Hospital #32, who died December 30, 1917, in France.

2. In reply I regret to inform you that it would be impracticable to comply with your request as the Secretary of War has decided, on the recommendation of General Pershing, that the remains of army employees be not shipped from France to the United States during the continuance of the war. This policy has been adopted in view of the difficulties in shipping the remains home, as reported by General Pershing, and the Department is unable to deviate from the policy adopted.

3. You are advised, however, that if in the future it is found to be practicable to ship the remains home in accordance with your request, it will be done.







Diagram represents the mouth wide open.




