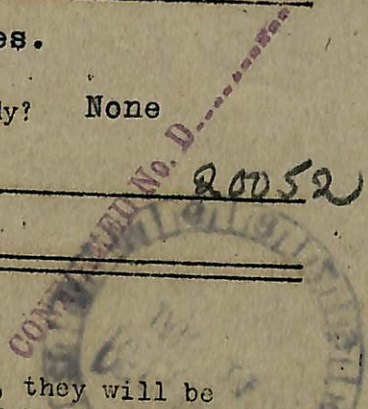

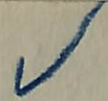



The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

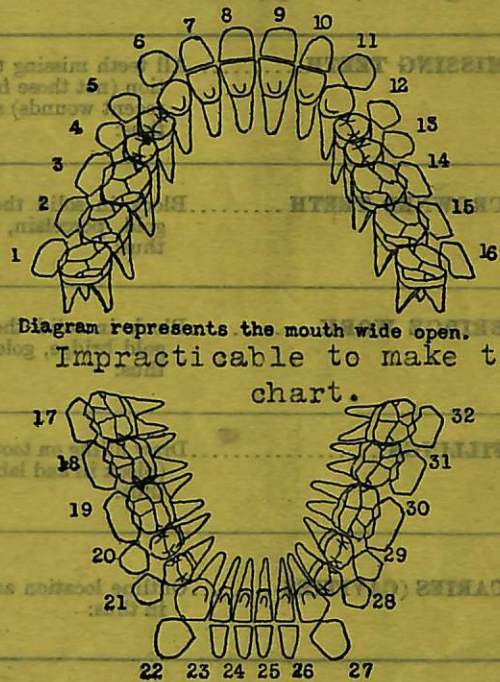


Diagram represents the mouth wide open. Impracticable to make tooth chart.




