Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the **sister-in-law** of the late Private Adolph Biedzycki, Co. B, 16th Engrs., whose remains are now interred in the St. Mihiel American Cemetery, Thiaucourt, Meurthe-et-Moselle, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.

For your reply, you may use the enclosed envelope which requires no postage.

Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

Please be assured that in effecting removal of the dead, the utmost reverential care was exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. For the future, these graves will be perpetually maintained by the Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

1. Wish to report the death of Private Adolph Biedzycki, Company B, 16th Engineers (Ry.), A. E. F., on the morning of November 25, 1917. Death occurred in line of duty and was not the result of the soldier's misconduct.
2. Verdict of the Medical Officer was that death was due to heart failure. Body was removed to Base Hospital #17 at Dijon and autopsy performed.
3. Interment of body took place on November 27, 1917, with military honors. Deceased was buried in grave No. 320, Polygone 4, Cemetary de Pejoces, Dijon, Cote d'Or, France.
4. This report is made in letter form account proper Quartermaster forms not being available.

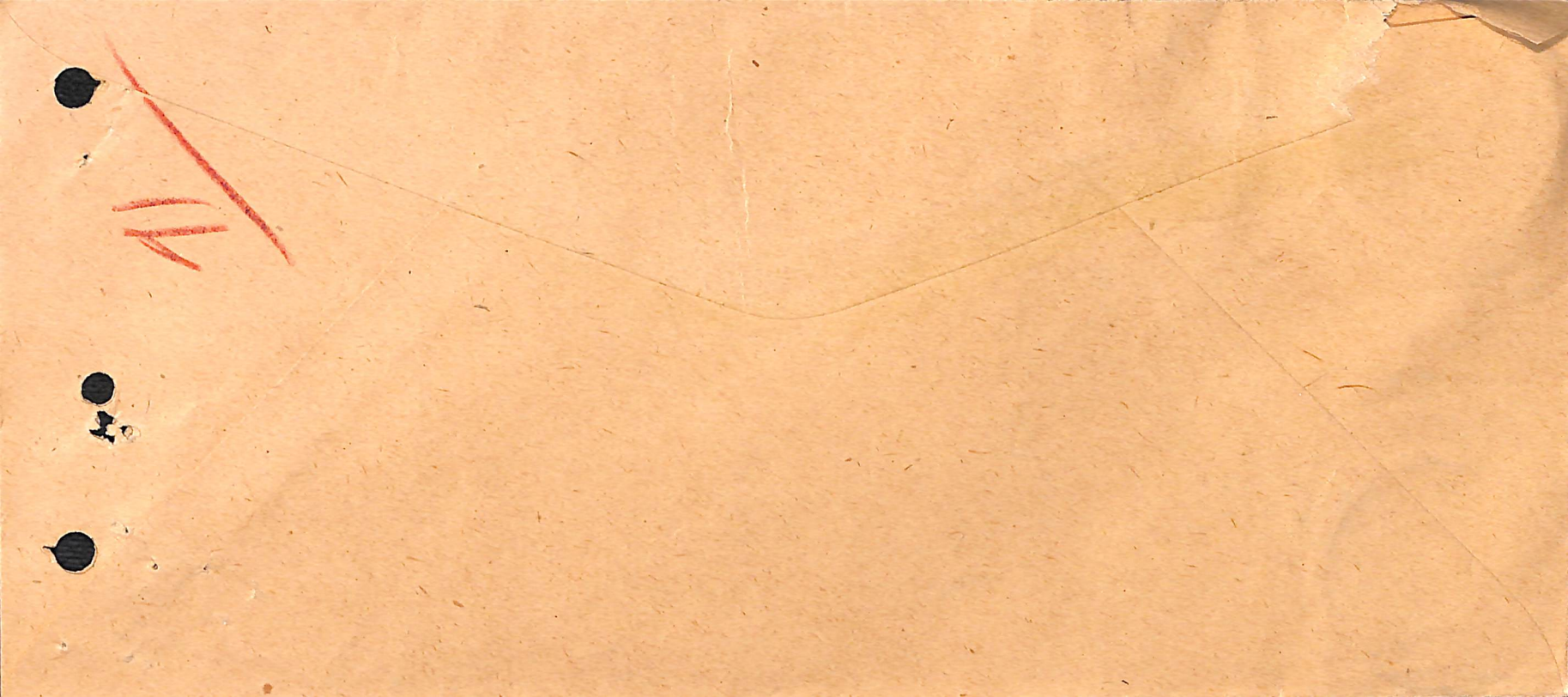
