



In this connection you are advised it has been held that the term widow means a widow who has not remarried since the death of the member of the military or naval forces. Upon remarriage, the widow loses her right to the benefits of the Act and becomes ineligible under the law to make this pilgrimage. The subsequent change in her status can not have the effect of restoring her eligibility.

In view of the foregoing, I regret to advise that Mrs. Chillion, the remarried widow of the late Corporal Truiett B. Bishop is not eligible under the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

Dear Sir:

I am addressing this letter to you in behalf of a widow of an enlisted man who was in my organization in the United States and over seas, and I am in nowise writing you as a lawyer. I was First Lieutenant in Company "F", 358th Inf., 90th Division.

Mrs. Mable Bishop, who was the wife of Truiett B. Bishop before he was drafted in the Army and until his death on September 12, 1918, has come to me with regard to the government trip over seas. Truiett B. Bishop was killed in action on September 12, 1918.

On June 18, 1925, Mrs. Bishop re-married and the marriage has been unsatisfactory and I can sincerely state that this good woman is still living with a memory of her first husband, who was killed in action. As a matter of fact, she is separating from her present husband and intends to file a suit for divorce as soon as she has done the necessary residence in Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, where she formerly was a trained nurse.

Since the former Mrs. Bishop has one practical desire and that is to visit the localities where Truiett B. Bishop was trained and the place where he was burried, is it possible under the circumstances that she would be allowed her expenses from the Government for such a trip?





Diagram represents the mouth wide open
