The records of this office show that you are the brother of the late Corporal Maurice Blake, Co. K. 23rd Inf., whose remains are now interred in the Aisne-Marne American Cemetery, Belleau, Aisne, France.

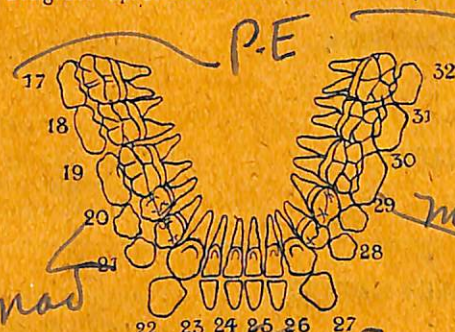

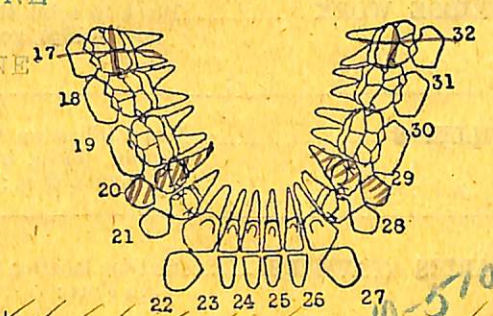
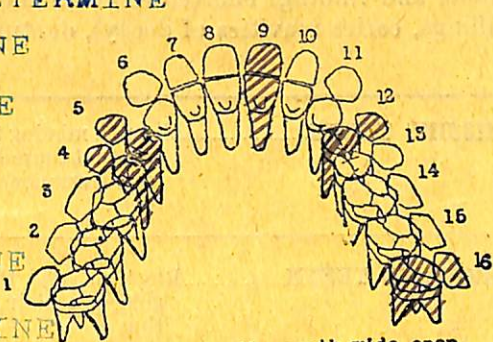

DECISIONS

1. BURIALS. Responsibility for, - "Burial department" (name changed to G.R.S.) "now operating for purpose of securing and maintaining government cemeteries at proper places and recording burials. Dead at the front must necessarily be buried by units themselves." (Cable C-in-C, Dec. 30, 1917.)
2. EMERGENCY BURIALS.- "In those communes where an American Cemetery has not been established, there is no reason why a portion of the communal cemetery should not be reserved for American combatants." (Letter French C-in-C, Nov. 26th, 1917.)
3. CEMETERIES, Selection of. - The choice of the sites of the cemeteries destined for the Allied Armies will be exercised by qualified representatives of the Allied Armies, assisted by French officers to be designated by the C-in-C. (French Circular Feb. 17th, 1916.)
