I applied 1st Aid to Blaschka when the latter was wounded on the Argonne front, about Oct. 14, 1918. Blaschka was wounded in the leg and arm and at that time his wounds did not appear severe, altho Blaschka complained of pains in the stomach, but I could find no sign of his having been wounded there. I did not know until about one month later that Blaschka had died.

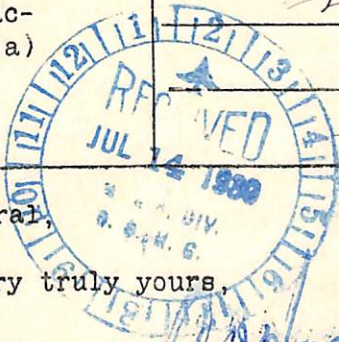

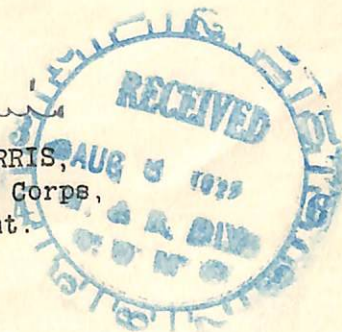

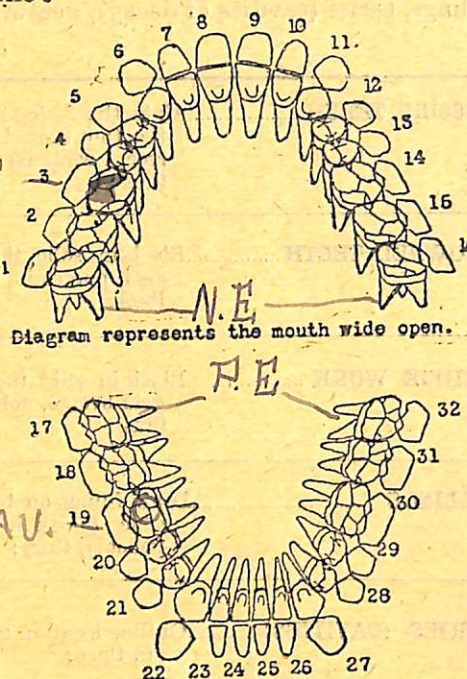
