Clarence Baldwin was not a casualty during the War but was discharged. His death recently occurred Dec. 17, 1922. His father and mother, Mrs. and Frank T. Baldwin live 17307-104 Road, Hillside L.I. Jamaica, N.Y. He was reported as having died Sept. 18, 1918 of pneumonia in A.M.R.C. Hospital #5. At the time of reported death, nearest relative was given as, mother, Mrs. Helen B. Mesk(Mensk) Hobeiyn, Slutska, Odessa, Russia.

At the same period there was in the Hospital, Victor Bogdan, who was gassed. At the time of transfer of patients from one hospital to the other the names of these two men became confused, inasmuch as the father of Bogdan is reported as Andrew Bogdan, Province of Minsk(Mensk) Russia and the mother as Helen Bogdan, Mensk Russia and now as Ellen Jacucovich, Village Maloshevitz, Volost Chaplicy, Co. Slutzk, Province Minsk, Russia.

It is clearly evident that the two names became confused in the hospital in view of the confusion of the emergency addressee for Baldwin has been traced through hospitals to time of his discharge.

In view of evidence on body it is identified as Bogdan.

Clarence Baldwin was not a casualty during the War but was discharged. His death recently occurred Dec. 17, 1922. His father and mother, Mrs. and Frank T. Baldwin, live 17307-104 Road, Hillside L.I. Jamaica, N.Y. He was reported as having died Sept. 18, 1918 of pneumonia in A.M.R.C. Hospital #5. At the time of reported death, nearest relative was given as, mother, Mrs. Helen B. Mesk(Mensk) Hobeiyn, Slutska, Odessa, Russia.

At the same period there was in the Hospital, Victor Bogdan, who was gassed. At the time of transfer of patients from one hospital to the other the names of these two men became confused, inasmuch as the father of Bogdan is reported as Andrew Bogdan, Province of Minsk(Mensk) Russia and the mother as Helen Bogdan, Minsk Russia and now as Ellen Jacucovich, Village Maloshevitzki, Volost Chaplicy, Co. Slutzk, Province Minsk, Russia.

It is clearly evident that the two names became confused in the hospital in view of the confusion of the emergency addressee for Baldwin has been traced through hospitals to time of his discharge.

In view of evidence on body it is identified as Bogdan.


