1. The permanent grave of this soldier is No. 16, Row 5, Block C, Suresnes American Cemetery at Suresnes, Department of Seine, France.
2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.
3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

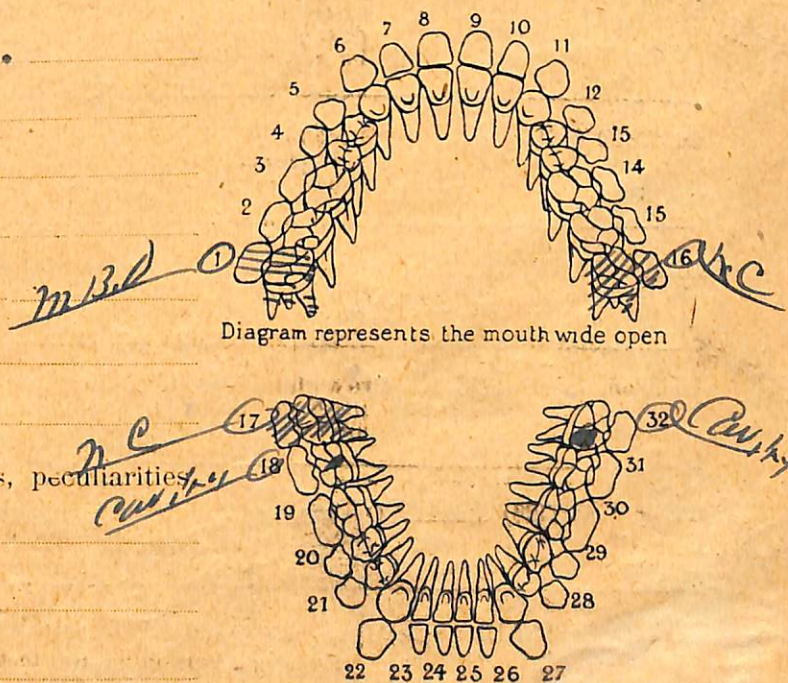



INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.

With reference to your file number A718/20, you are advised that the remains of the late Private Wladyslaw Bogdanowicz, 8th Company 4th Motor Mechanics, may be permanently interred in their present resting place, provided the legal next of kin, who is determined according to the provisions of paragraph #5 of the enclosed bulletin, executes and returns to this office the enclosed G.R.S. Form #123.

2. For your information, you are advised that it is the policy of the Government to concentrate the remains of our soldier dead which are to be permanently interred in France in the permanent American Cemeteries referred to in paragraph #9 of the enclosed bulletin where such action is desired by the legal next of kin. These permanent cemeteries will be perpetually maintained by the United States Government in the most careful and reverent manner.

3. It is desired that this office be advised immediately whether the legal next of kin of the deceased desires the body interred in its present resting place or removed to one of the permanent American Cemeteries in France.

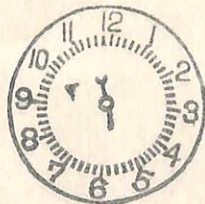

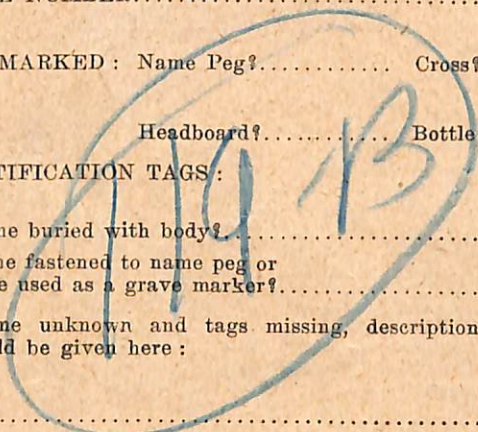
