History of Present complaint: June 20th, near Soissons, Pilgrim left bus during an emergency stop and insisted upon crossing a ditch. She had been warned against crossing by the conductor. In attempting to cross this ditch she fell, sustaining an injury to her left foot and ankle. She was taken back to her hotel in Soissons, examined by the surgeon and given necessary medical care. June 21st she was sent to Paris by auto with a special nurse, taken directly to the American Hospital where x-ray revealed a simple, incomplete fracture of the left os calcis. Physical exam (over) shows a teno-synovitis of left ankle and annular ligaments.

INSTRUCTIONS. This card will be started in all cases of Pilgrims requiring medical attention by the Medical Officer or Nurse first rendering such attention. Subsequently it will be carried by the nurse in attendance upon the group to which the Pilgrim is assigned. All Medical Officers rendering any assistance in the case will make an appropriate entry which will include date, time and signature. Upon final disposition of the case the Nurse in charge will deliver the card to the Office of the Chief Surgeon. Major Ashcraft:

X-Ray shows "FRACTURE, INCOMPLETE, EXTERNAL AND PLANTAR SURFACE OF LEFT OS CALCIS" NO CALLUS FORMATION NOTED IN FILM.

As there is still some swelling around ankle. A mild pressure bandage was applied with recommendation that the bathe the foot in hot water for twenty (2) minutes, at two hr intervals, followed by mild massage with olive or linseed oil. It was believed that in two or three days' treatment will suffice to reduce swelling so that adhesive strapping can be used.

It is believed that it will be at least six weeks to two months before the bone will be healed sufficiently to bear full weight on heel, but with crutches and ordinary care, she should be able to travel to her home in San Francisco within the next few days.

I believe, however, she should be given a drawing room as, in her condition, it would be difficult for her to get along the isles of a moving train to make use of the toilet facilities.

Mrs. Lillian H. Boggs who broke her ankle in France on June 20th, was transferred from the steamship to her room at the hotel by means of wheel chair and taxi. She was held over at the hotel for special medical attention and will be returned to her home in company of a nurse on July 8th.

Mrs. Lettie M. Judd became ill a few hours prior to her scheduled departure. Her illness was diagnosed as pharyngitis, acute. She was attended by the Medical Supervisor and as her condition did not warrant hospitalization, she is being held at the hotel pending her recovery.

Mrs. Annie E. Hanson, a Myocarditis case, was transferred from the steamship to the hotel by means of a wheel chair and taxi, accompanied by a nurse. She departed for her home on July 4th, in company of special nurse, Alice L. Wood.

Mrs. Elizabeth Meyer, who complained of foot trouble as a result of wearing new shoes, was attended by the nurse while at the Hotel. She insisted, however, upon leaving for her home on schedule.

Mrs. Linnie Rongey complained of a foreign substance in her eye. The Medical Supervisor examined her eye and found nothing.

Mrs. Laura Dieterich complained of a headache and was treated by the Medical Supervisor.

June 26 - Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Seibold are not satisfied with room 100.

June 27 - About 6 p.m. Mr. Geo Seibold called at my stateroom - complained of room assigned himself and wife. Asked how assignments were made etc etc Said the law called for "first-class" accommodations and that their room was not first-class. Mrs. Seibold was too large for the bed, no bath, etc. I informed him that they were so assigned because he had bought and paid for that particular space and that he had requested quarters with his wife. His contention was that Mrs. Seibold ought to have been assigned a better room with bath and that he should have been assigned to her room. I went to the Purser and verified his ticket. Purser agreed to allow them to transfer to Room 21 which was inspected by the Seibolds and accepted. These two persons are nuisances of a difficult kind.

June 27 - Mrs. Helen J. Roberts complained to nurses about her room - No. 246-C * * * Her complaint is based largely on the fact that she had a room to herself Eastbound ***** See REPORT page 2

June 28 Mrs. L. H. Boggs who is confined to her room with a broken foot progressing. * * Incensed by circulation of rumor that she will bring suit for \$50,000 against Government. *** She praises treatment accorded her. See REPORT page 2

Mrs. Minnie Smith is in bed with a lame back caused, she says, by assisting Mrs. H. Shaw around during the trips to the Cemetery etc. Mrs. Shaw is large and particularly helpless. Mrs. Smith claims to have complained to her lieutenant concerning her burden but got no relief. She thinks a few days rest will cure her. Says she had several operations for cancer on her back and it was permanently weakened thereby.

Roommate complained that Mrs. Mary C. Stedman had been ill all day had called for food which had not been sent. It developed Mrs. Stedman had informed nurses she wanted no food or brandy. Food was sent and Chief Stewart notified of lack of service in this case. See REPORT for full details.

Mrs. B. L. Harding was moved by me during the day to Room 100 E because her medicated cigarettes which she smokes for asthma were nauseating her roommates.

Mrs. Helen J. Roberts requested to be moved to Mrs. Harding's old room and this was done.

In reply to your letter of March 13, 1921, referred to this office by The Adjutant General of the Army, you are advised that the records of this office contain your request that the remains of your son, the late Corporal Edwin W. Boggs, be permanently interred in France and instructions will be issued that your wishes be complied with presuming that there is no one else entitled to direct disposition. If there is any such relative, using paragraph #5 of the enclosed bulletin as a guide, it is requested that you immediately advise this office to that effect.

2. According to the present policy of concentration, the remains of our soldier dead now temporarily interred in the Kerfautras Cemetery at Lambazellec, Department of Finistere, will at some future date be transferred to the Suresnes American Cemetery, Department of Seine, (near Paris).

3. The graves of our soldier dead are being carefully maintained by the Government, numerous letters of commendation have been received by this office from relatives and friends visiting abroad, with respect to the care and attention that is being given the graves of the American soldier dead.

4. This office regrets that it is unable to advise you to whom, near the cemetery, you may write relative to the above matter. This office, however, is addressing a letter to the American Red Cross with request that you be advised either to whom you may write, or that one of its workers advise you personally regarding the condition and care of the grave.





X-Ray shows "FRACTURE, INCOMPLETE, EXTERNAL AND PLANTAR SURFACE OF LEFT OS CALCIS" NO CALLUS FORMATION NOTED IN FILM.

As there is still some swelling around ankle. A mild pressure bandage was applied with recommendation that she bathe the foot in hot water for twenty (2) minutes, at two hr intervals, followed by mild massage with olive or linseed oil. It was believed that in two or three days' treatment will suffice to reduce swelling so that adhesive strapping can be used.

It is believed that it will be at least six weeks to two months before the bone will be healed sufficiently to bear full weight on heel, but with crutches and ordinary care, she should be able to travel to her home in San Francisco within the next few days.

I believe, however, she should be given a drawing room as, in her condition, it would be difficult for her to get along the isles of a moving train to make use of the toilet facilities.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open. #11 not erupted


