

1. An explanation is requested regarding the following discrepancies noted in Cemetery #758, Haricourt, Haute-Saone:

On January 31, 1921, the body of William Reynolds, Co. F, 352nd Inf., was reported to have been found in Grave #95, which grave the body was supposed to have been in.

The same date the body of William T. Bohn, Headquarters Company, 351st Infantry, is reported to have been found in Grave #96, which grave the body was supposed to have been in.

On January 18, 1921, the body of William C. Jackson, which was supposed to have been in Grave #97, is reported to have been found in Grave #95.

On January 15, 1921, the body of Perry L. Smith, Company M, 351st Infantry, was found in Grave #98 - supposed to have been in this grave.

On January 13, 1921, the body of Alpha Gaston, 3229111, Company G, 352nd Infantry, is reported to have been found in Grave #98. This body was supposed to have been in Grave #99. On this same date the body of Wesley Ballinger, Co. D, 339th M. G. Bn., supposed to have been buried in Grave #100, is reported to have been found in Grave #99.

There is no report on Graves #97 and 100. Reports show two bodies taken from graves #95 and 98.
