" The company was digging in in a new position , under very heavy shell fire . Pvt. Boisse was hit by a piece of high explosive and his foot blown off , just above the ankle . One of the men bandaged the wound and he was placed on a litter . While lying on the litter , Pvt. Boisse held his injured leg in the air and yelled : " Give em Hell , boys , my hiking days are over . " He lay on the litter for a short time and was carried back to a first aid station .

Nothing has been heard from Pvt. Boisse , since he was evacuated to Hospital . "



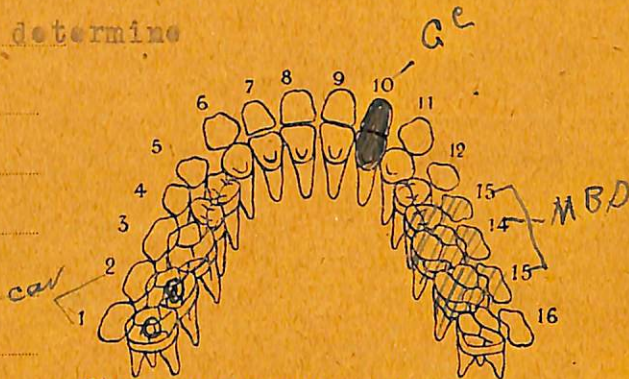
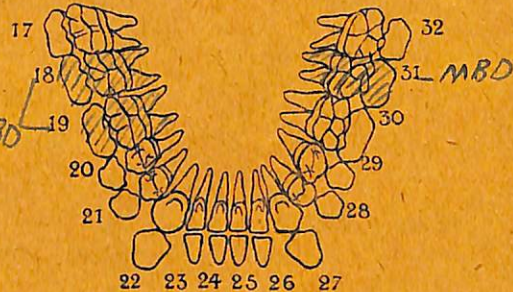


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

5. If there are minor children of the deceased soldier and no widow, the LEGALLY APPOINTED GUARDIAN of the children should ascertain their wishes and act for them in this matter.

6. If YOU are not the nearest next of kin, please ask the nearest next of kin, if living near you, to fill out this paper.

7. If YOU are not the nearest living next of kin and do not know who or where the nearest relatives are, please fill out this paper AT ONCE and mail to this office.

8. You are requested to return this paper AT ONCE in order to avoid delay in the case of this body.

NOTE.—INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE DISPOSITION OF REMAINS will be issued by this office upon the properly executed authority of the legal next of kin in each case.
