On the morning of October 27th 1918 while the 26th division was occupying the sector North of Verdun, a German aeroplane dropped bombs on the place where the 101st Engineers train was stationed. Cook Boisvert was killed and two members of the 101st engineer train wounded by the dropping of these bombs. He was killed at 10.30 hours. October 27th 1918, at Caserne Neil Thierville (Verdun). He was buried in Grave # 18. American sectional Cemetery. Caserne Bevaux. Verdun.

Block C, Meuse-Argonne American cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon,
Department of Meuse, France.

2. This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries
to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be
marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name,
rank, organization and date of soldier's death. The headstones will
be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in
progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action
or request on the part of relatives.

3. In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were
exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this
sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually main-
tained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting
place of our heroes.

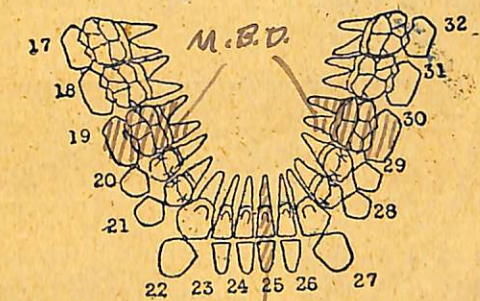
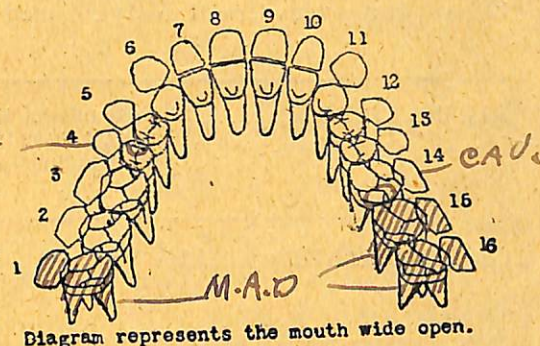

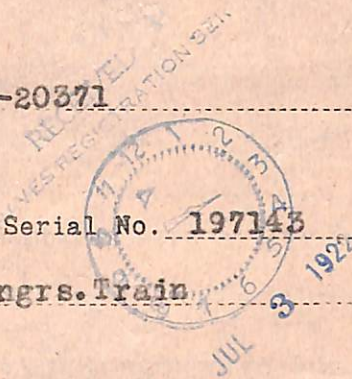
