Receipt is acknowledged of your communication of recent date furnishing information requested in connection with the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929. The delay in reply is due to the voluminous correspondence received relative to this Act.

It is assumed that you desire the privilege of making the pilgrimage to the grave of your brother, the late Private Anthony Belmos, Company M, 109th Infantry in the Oise-Aisne American Cemetery in France, under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act, which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law, a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as your brother was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 26 years and 7 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that you are ineligible under the law to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of recent date relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929.

In reply you are advised that the above mentioned Act provides that an invitation for a pilgrimage shall be extended the mothers and widows of the members of the military or naval forces of the United States who are buried in the cemeteries in Europe, provided they have not made a previous visit thereto, but it does not contain any provision which will permit of anyone making the pilgrimage in the place of the mother or widow.

If you can qualify under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act of March 2, 1929, which states, "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces," and have not made a previous visit to the grave of your brother, you will be entitled to make this pilgrimage. If this be the case, please advise.

If, however, you cannot qualify under this provision, it is regretted to have to advise you that you are not eligible under the Act to make the pilgrimage.

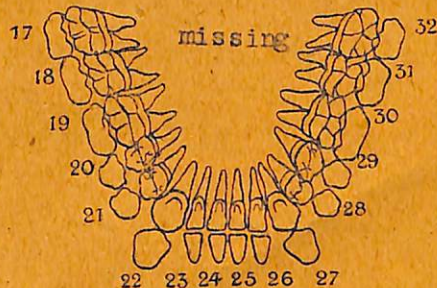


