


Dear Madam:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of February 17th, relative to your eligibility under the provisions of section 4 (a) of the Act of March 2, 1929, to make the pilgrimage to the grave of your brother, the late Private William T. Boland in the Somme American Cemetery in France.

It has been held that a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult, unless that adult is mentally or physically incapacitated, and in order for a woman to occupy such a status (in loco parentis) towards a minor, she must act the part of a lawful father of such person in performing the duty of providing for him, intending thereby to take the place of the father in this particular.

In view of the fact that the father of Private Boland was living at the time of his enlistment, and apparently providing for his family, you could not have stood in loco parentis to your brother within the meaning of the law.

I therefore regret to advise that you are ineligible within the meaning of the law, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open






