BOND was killed on either the 5th or the 6th of November 1918 about a mile and a half southwest of Montigny. The battalion was in bivouac here and a stray shell came over and exploded near BOND. A shrapnel hit him in the left temple. Death was instantaneous. He was buried on the side of a road. leading into Montigny from the south.
