1. Upon investigation it has been ascertained by the War Department that Private first class Scripi Bonisolli, #544,307, Machine Gun Company, 30th Infantry, who was previously reported in Casualty Cablegram 224 as severely wounded in action July 25th, 1918, and later in Casualty Cablegram 482 as dead, date and cause of death to be determined, was killed in action July 25th, 1918.

2. It appears from the records that the deceased was enlisted April 26th, 1917 at Columbus Barracks, Ohio, and gave the name of the person to be notified in case of emergency as Mr. August Bonisolli, Burgettstown, Pennsylvania, (Father).

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
