Dear Madam:

Upon your arrival in New York City you will be met at the railroad station by an Army Officer who will engage porter service to take care of your baggage and escort you to the hotel. During your sojourn here before sailing for Europe and upon your return from Europe, you will stop at the Hotel McAlpin, 34th Street and Broadway, New York City.

The two tags and four identification pasters accompanying this communication are intended to protect your baggage while in transit. One tag should be attached to the handle of each piece of your baggage and a paster placed on each end of each piece of your baggage before leaving your home. Your baggage will be safer and also more readily available to you after your arrival in New York if it is placed with you on the train.


All mail intended to reach you between June 7th, 1933, the day you sail from the United States, and June 29th, 1933, the day you leave Europe, should be addressed to you in care of American Pilgrimage, 20 Rue Molitor, Paris (16), France, for example:

The party you are to travel with will be disbanded in New York City on the day following your return from Europe and all arrangements for your Pullman accommodations will be made with the railroads in advance by this office. This will require you to remain in New York at the hotel over night as a guest of the United States Government.

Information relative to the cemeteries in Europe is enclosed herewith.

Dear Madam:

Immediately following receipt of your acceptance of the invitation to make a pilgrimage to Europe, sailing on June 27, 1933, a letter containing general information of importance was mailed to you. In this letter you were told how to proceed to obtain a passport which you must have before you can visit Europe. Your passport has not yet been received in this office.

If it is your intention to make the pilgrimage you should go at once to the Clerk of the U. S. District Court, Dallas, Texas, taking with you:

1. Four (4) photographs of yourself on thin paper (unmounted) not more than 3 x 3 inches or less than 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in size.
2. Your invitation and any evidence of citizenship you may have.
3. Someone who has known you for at least two years to identify you.

The Clerk will help you fill out the application and HE will forward it to the State Department, Washington, D. C. Your passport will be delivered to you aboard the boat. No charge will be made for the application or passport.

If you have changed your mind and do not intend to make the pilgrimage please so inform this office at once. It is necessary to know at this time whether or not you intend to make the pilgrimage in order that reservation and other necessary arrangements may be made for you.

It is requested you advise whether you are making application for your passport or whether you have decided not to make a pilgrimage. A self-addressed envelope which requires no postage is enclosed for your convenience in replying.

I am indeed glad that your health has improved sufficiently to enable you to take advantage of this last offer of the Government to make a pilgrimage, and you are assured that everything possible will be done to make your trip comfortable and satisfactory.

With reference to your desire to have a companion accompany you on the pilgrimage you are advised that under the law the Government can bear no part of the expense of relatives or friends accompanying pilgrims on their journey, nor can it make any arrangements for them. It is of course possible for a relative or friend to accompany you at personal expense and it is estimated the entire journey would cost her \$700. Should anyone desire to make the trip with you at her own expense it is requested you notify this office and detailed information will be furnished as to the arrangements she should make.

Two hundred women have been invited to sail June 7th and I am sure you will find congenial companionship and make many friends among the mothers and widows in your party. It is therefore believed you should feel no hesitancy in making the journey alone.

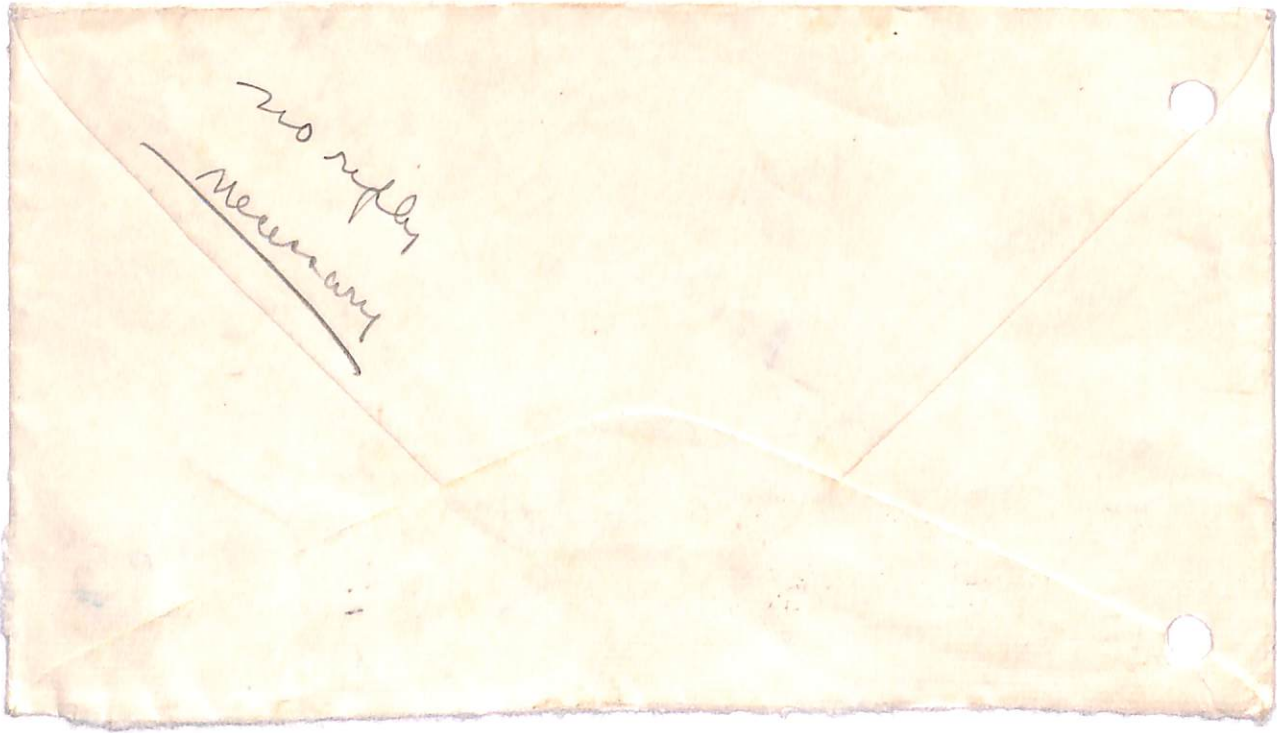

Dear Madam:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of February 2, 1932, advising that your health will not permit you to make the pilgrimage to Europe to visit the grave of your son, the late Private Loney Bocher.

It is indeed regretted that your health is not good, but it is believed if you were acquainted with the excellent care and attention you would receive, you would not hesitate to make the trip on that account.

In the event you decide to make a pilgrimage, an identification badge will be forwarded you to wear throughout the trip. The wearing of this badge assures you every attention, the railroad personnel rendering special care to the wearers of this emblem. Your local ticket agent will deliver your Pullman and railroad tickets and you will be furnished a detailed schedule of your trip. A check to cover the cost of your meals and incidental expenses to New York City will be forwarded to you about two weeks before you are scheduled to leave your home.

Upon arrival in New York City, you will be met at the station by an officer of the United States Army who will escort you to the hotel at which reservation has been made for you. It is probable that a number of other mothers and widows from Texas will make the journey at the same time and you would find congenial companionship. Medical attendants, nurses and all other necessities will be provided. The journey will be made without cost to you except for the purchase of any small articles of a personal nature which you might desire to obtain as souvenirs.

The pilgrimage was authorized by Congress in an endeavor to bring a measure of peace and comfort to the hearts of the mothers and widows whose loved ones gave their lives in their Country's cause, and it is evident from the number of letters received from women who have made the journey that this effort has not been in vain. A number of women have

also advised that they returned in better health than they had enjoyed in years.

It is possible you may reconsider and decide to make a pilgrimage at some time during the coming summer, and it is requested you so advise this office in order that the necessary arrangements may be made for you.

There is enclosed herewith a copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, as amended, which provides pilgrimages to the cemeteries of Europe by mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe. As the stepmother of the late Private Bocher you are eligible to visit his grave in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery in France at the expense of the Government. 1. Do you desire to make a pilgrimage in 1932.
2. Please state your age and give the condition of your health.
3. Do you speak English?
4. What other language do you speak?

Your attention is invited to the fact that all necessary expenses of the pilgrimage from your home to the grave of your stepson and return are borne by the United States. Personnel to care for your comfort and needs will be provided and doctors and nurses will be available. You are assured that the journey will not only be made at the expense of the Government but that everything possible for your welfare and pleasure will be provided.

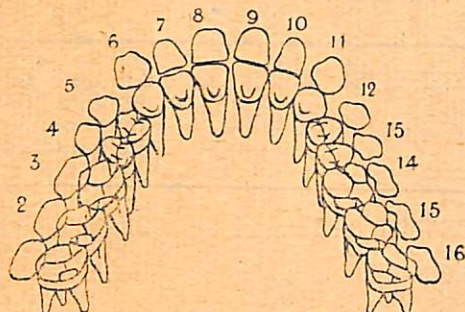
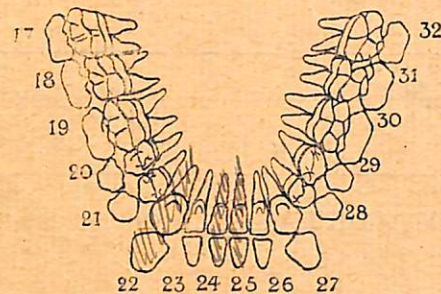


Diagram represents the mouth wide open
