The original grave location of Private Michael Borczynski, 2950991, Company I, 347th Infantry, as shown by the records of this office, is grave No. 29, Plot 2, Row 1, Cemetery # 159, American Cemetery, Romorantin, Loir-et-Cher, France. G.R.S. Forms 114-B and 114-A also show this grave location. Form 16-A gives the original grave location as grave No. 129, Cemetery #159.
