The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

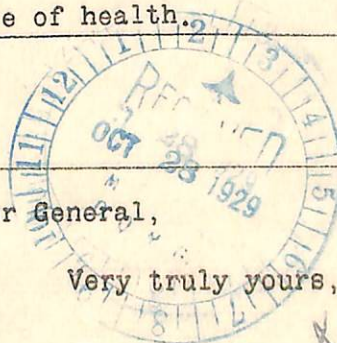

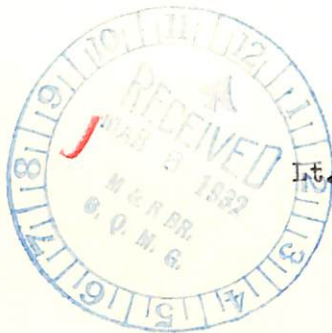


1. Under date of September 15, 1931, this office requested that the grave of the late Corporal Clive A. Boyer be photographed and two prints furnished for delivery to his mother.



The Quartermaster General desires you to be informed that the permanent grave of Corporal Clive A. Boyer, Company B, 354th Infantry, is Grave 15, Row 19, Block F, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagnous-Montfaucon (Meuse), France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

You are assured in effecting removal of the remains, the utmost care and reverence were exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. 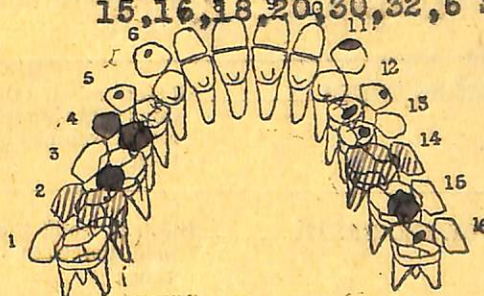
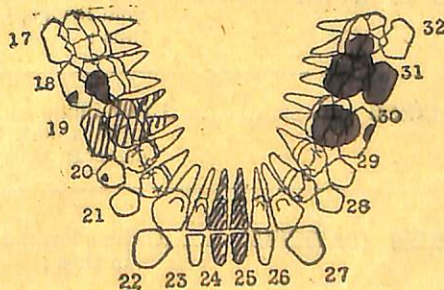

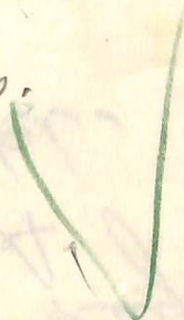

On Nov. 1st 1918, Cpl Boyer fell wounded in the roadway just before we reached Remonville, France, and as there was a 1st aid man in the rear of him, not more than 100 yds, we thought that they would find him so we continued our advance.

There are various tales concerning this man, some say that he died in the Ambulance but nothing definite is known at this station.
