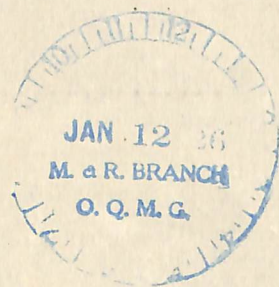

There is no one present in the Company who saw Private J. F. Bradley before he died; but it is known that he was killed at the Ourcq River the morning of July 28, 1918, in connection with the Aisne Marne Offensive. Our Company advanced N.E. from the vicinity of Viller-sur-Fere under heavy machine gun fire, July 28, 4 A.M. and we met with heavy resistance at the river Ourcq, where soldier was killed. He is buried S.E. Meurcy Farm, 1 kilo N.E. of Viller-sur-Fere. Soldier was of excellent character and well known for his great courage and bravery in action.

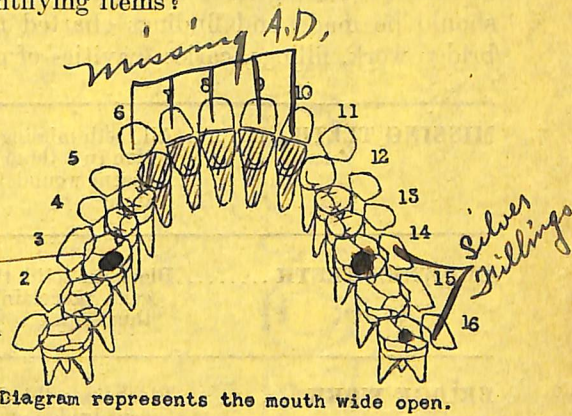
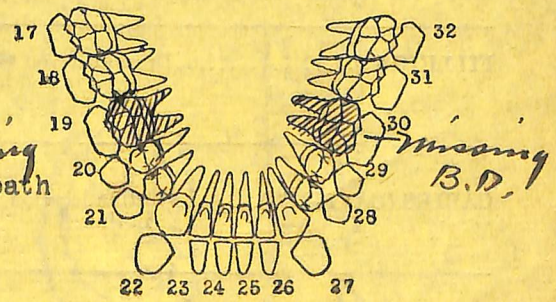


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

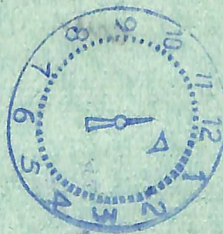
