Permit me to express the deep sympathy of the Department on account of the great loss you have sustained in the death of your son George Braziel.

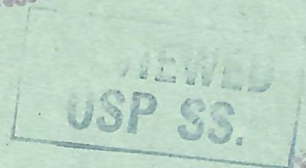
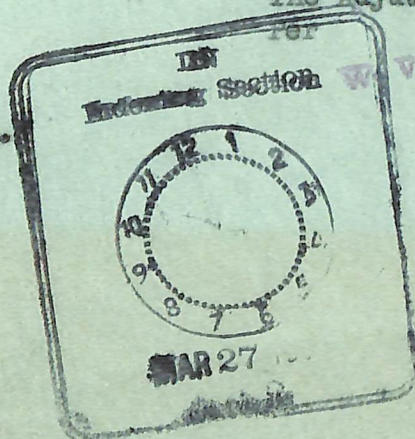
