Killed in action Sept. 27th, 1918. "We were going up the road in single file, at about 10:30 A.M. with our platoon when we saw the road ahead of us, was being swept by Machine Gun fire. We decided to go back for a time. We had some new men with us, and they became excited. I called out Sgt. Breen that he had better get more interval between men. Just then the Germans began to send the High Explosives over. One shell struck right on the side of the road. A piece of the shell struck the Sgt. in the head and he died instantly. He was buried along side of the road about midway between Mont Blainville and Varennes, on the evening of the day that he killed. His grave is on the left hand side of the road going towards Mont Blainville, at a point where creeks nearest to the road."
