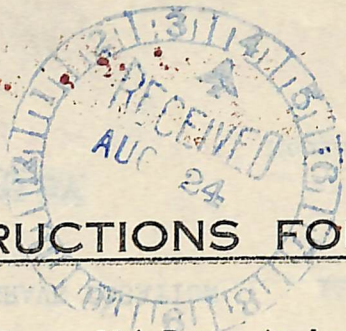

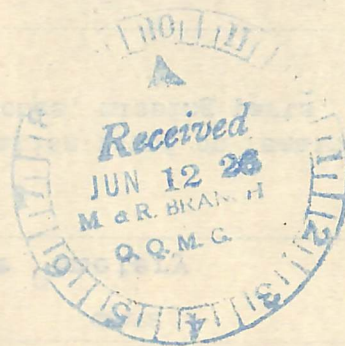

Killed in action Sept. 27th, 1918. "We were going up the road in single file, at about 10:30 A.M. with our platoon when we saw the road ahead of us, was being swept by Machine Gun fire. We decided to go back for a time. We had some new men with us, and they become excited. I called out Sgt. Breen that he had better get more interval between men. Just then the Germans began to send the High Explosives over. One shell struck right on the side of the road. A piece of the shell struck the Sgt. in the head and he died instantly. He was buried along side of the road about midway between Mont Blainville and Varennes, on the evening of the day that he killed. His grave is on the left hand side of the road going towards Mont Blainville, at a point where creek is nearest to the road."

3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".
(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

CROWNED TEETH.....Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, or gold and porcelain), thus :



BRIDGE WORK.....Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :



FILLINGS.....Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :



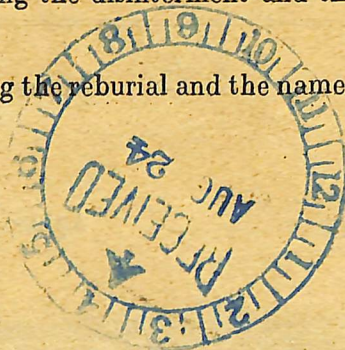

DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."
