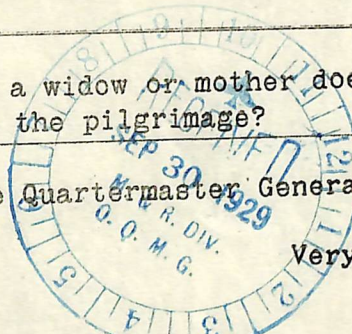

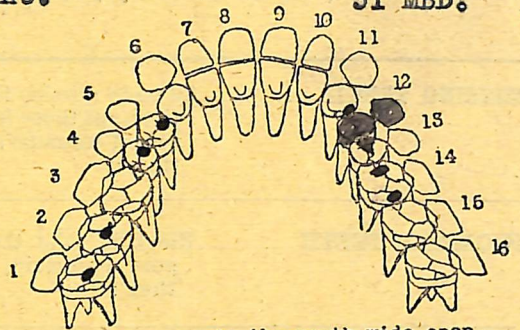
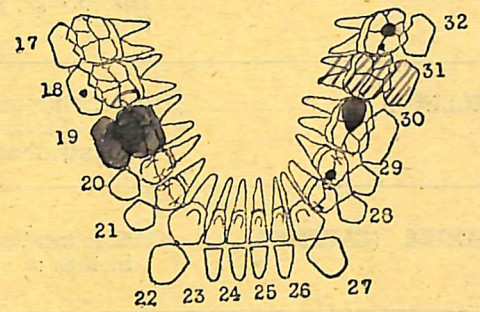


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

1. This office has been advised by Mr. R. Barnett, Jewish Welfare Board, New York City, through the representative of this organization in Washington, D.C., that you received a photograph of the grave of your son, the late Private Louis Brenner, Company D, 308th Infantry, which indicated that the grave of the deceased is marked by a cross instead of the Star of David, which designates the graves of our soldier dead of Hebrew Faith. This photograph was evidently made some time ago and its delivery to you was delayed, for the records of this office indicate now that the grave of the deceased is properly marked with the regulation marker used in cases of Jewish Dead and photograph that you have indicating such is the correct one.

2. This office is also advised that you desire the body of the deceased returned to this country, instead of being permanently interred in France as previously requested. In this connection you are advised that the progress of the work in France has rendered it necessary to establish a definite policy governing requests relative to the disposition of remains of soldier dead; therefore, the Secretary of War has directed that no change of requests relative to the return of a body will be considered after August 15th 1921.

3. The body of the deceased is now interred in Grave 145, Section 82, Plot 3, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery. This is a permanent American Cemetery and the grave will be perpetually maintained by this Government in the most careful and reverent manner.

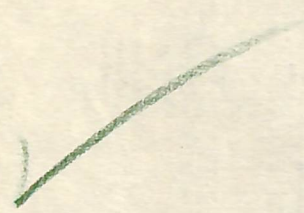
