





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.



1. In reply to your letter of November 13th, 1921, you are advised that the records of this office contain your request that the remains of your brother, the late Private Cornelius J. Briody, Company 1, 309th Infantry, be permanently interred in France, and instructions have been issued that your wishes be complied with.
2. The progress of the work in France has rendered it necessary to establish a definite policy governing requests relative to the disposition of remains of soldier dead, therefore, the Secretary of War has directed that no change of requests relative to the return of a body will be considered after August 15th, 1921.
3. This office regrets that it is unable to comply with your request, but in view of the above policy, it is too late to issue instructions for the return of these remains.
4. The American Cemetery of the Meuse-Argonne, wherein the remains of the deceased are now interred, is a permanent American Cemetery, and the grave will be marked by a suitable headstone and perpetually maintained by this Government in a most careful and reverent manner.


