Receipt is acknowledged of form letter of this office dated October 2, 1929, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by the Act of Congress of March 2, 1929.

With reference to your inquiry as to whether or not you would be permitted to visit your brother's grave in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery in France, you are advised that the Act referred to above does not contain any provision which will permit of anyone other than the mother or widow making the pilgrimage. The only condition under which you would be eligible would be by qualifying under the provisions of Section 4(a) of the Act, which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

In order for you to qualify under this provision, it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of the relationship, (in loco parentis), the affidavits of at least two persons not related to you. In this connection, it is suggested that the enclosed form be completed and returned to this office in order that your eligibility under the Act may be determined. Under Paragraph 1(c) and 1(d), sufficient information should be included to permit an intelligible decision as to eligibility.
