

Receipt is acknowledged of the questionnaire completed by you, relative to the pilgrimage of mothers and widows to the cemeteries of Europe.

With reference to your statement that you do not desire to make the pilgrimage without your husband, you are advised the Government can bear no part of the expense of relatives or friends accompanying pilgrims on the journey, nor can it provide them with medical attention or assume any responsibility for them.

Should your husband desire to accompany you at personal expense, however, it is suggested he communicate with the United States Lines, 45 Broadway, New York City, who will furnish complete information as to steamship fares and reservations. Arrangements should also be made with the American Express Company, 1414 F St., N. W., Washington, D. C., for hotel accommodations and transportation abroad. In the event Mr. Brolin wishes to be quartered with you on the trip he should secure first class accommodations at hotels abroad and cabin class accommodations aboard ship. 

Dear Sir:

This office is in receipt of a letter dated March 30, 1928 from Mr. A.R. Davidson, Anaconda, Montana, written in your behalf, referring to the inscription which appears on the permanent marble cross now over the grave of your son, Corporal Harry W. Brolin, 6th Prov. Ord. Detach., whose remains permanently repose in the St. Mihiel American Cemetery, at Thiaucourt (Meurthe-et-Moselle), Grave 3, Block A, Row 28, and advising that the state "Illinois" should be "Montana," as your son was born in Anaconda, Montana.

In this connection, the following decision was made by a Board of Officers which convened at Washington, D.C., April 26, 1922 to consider the headstone for World War veterans, which decision was subsequently approved by The Secretary of War:

"That the full name of the soldier with the state from which he came, his rank, regiment and division, with date of death, appear on the face of the stone."

That part of this decision which reads "the state from which he came" was further explained as follows:

"The name of the state to be inscribed on the cross is the one in which the soldier lived at the time of his induction into the service through the draft and as shown on enlistment papers. If the soldier enlisted voluntarily at a recruiting station, the state given by him as his residence at the time of his enlistment, should govern."

It would appear that the reason for this decision was based on the Board's desire to work out a uniform plan for inscribing the permanent markers, based on the records of the War Department, it being impracticable in a great number of cases to ascertain the "state of birth" of the deceased veteran, due to the change of address of the next of kin and other causes.

A letter has been addressed to The Quartermaster General of the Army this date, requesting the state of entry into the Service in the case of your son be verified, and if an error has been made, you may rest assured that im-





