About 9:00 o'clock on the morning of Sept. 12th during the St. Mihiel offensive we were lying down in the open field waiting for the barrage to raise. Cpl. Bromige was lying on his side and while in the act of looking around to see his squad he was caught in the abdomen with a machine gun bullet. He cried for first aid but there being no first aid men around another Sgt. and myself crawled over and relieved him of his pack. By the time we removed his cartridge belt he had died. I do not know where he was buried.
